ALCCRF Chairperson Update


Welcome to the June 2023 edition of the Foundations newsletter.

It was good to catch up with Lions from all over the Multiple District at the Gold Coast Convention and the interest many had in what the Foundation is doing, the support by Lions Clubs is fantastic.

A big thank you to Lions Vanners Club for raising \$7,000, especially Allan and Mick who had a haircut and beard removal respectively at the Foundation's convention booth (The story and photos in this newsletter).

On the Sunday afternoon of the convention, Professor Mark von Itzstein, from the Griffith University's Institute for Glycomics (Gold Coast), addressed conventioneers on the work of the Institute and the Sarcoma Project that the ALCCRF has funded. On the Tuesday after the convention concluded the Institute hosted the Trustees for a tour their premises and a more in-depth update of the project. They also hosted the Trustee face-to-face meeting in their boardroom, for which we were extremely grateful.

I would also like to acknowledge the efforts of the Lions Club of Park Orchards (V5) for raising \$10,500 from the auctioning of a restored classic motor bike. This initiative was started by the late Lion Andy Margetts and continued by the club with the blessing of Andy's family. A big thank you to all who participated in this initiative (that story is also in this edition of the newsletter).

My usual quarterly update of our current projects is as follows:-

- 1. Telethon Kids Institute (TKI) Paediatric Cancer Immunotherapy (\$1.05m) That component of the project now completed. Additional new funding of \$200k approved, Outstanding commitment \$200,000.
- 2. Cancer Australia, Priority-Driven Collaborative Cancer Research Scheme
 - a) Dr Jessica Buck Exploiting and enhancing brain-resident immune cells for the treatment of paediatric brain stem glioma, University of Western Australia /TKI (\$54.8k) Outstanding commitment \$1,838.
 - b) Dr Pouya Faridi Novel targets for paediatric brain tumour immunotherapy, Monash University (\$73.3k) Outstanding commitment \$1,655.
 - c) Dr Klaartje Somers University of New South Wales/CCI (\$100k) Outstanding commitment \$100,000.

3. WEHI

- a. Tackling drug treatment resistance to medulloblastoma (\$220k) Outstanding commitment \$55,000.
- b. Enhancing CAR-T cell therapy to treat childhood leukemia (\$596k) Outstanding commitment \$447,000.
- 4. Griffith University's, Institute for Glycomics Focus on Sarcoma early markers, improve diagnosis targeting pathways to treatment (\$800k) Outstanding commitment \$350,000.
- 5. University of Newcastle Development precision immunotherapeutic strategy for paediatric brain tumours (\$635k) Outstanding commitment \$547,500.






Generous Donation from the Graham (Andy) Margetts Collection

At the 2021 MD Convention two members of the Vanners Club challenged the members to raise \$5,000 for the Australian Lions Childhood Cancer Research Foundation and they would grow their hair (Allan Millar) or beard (Mick Medcalf) until 2022. Unluckily for them the Perth Convention was cancelled, and they had to continue until this year.

The MD201 Lions Vanners Club is a social club with members from Lions Clubs across Australia that meet once a year to travel to the MD Convention raising funds along the way to donate to one of the Lions

Foundations. Over recent years we have donated to the Australian Lions Childhood Cancer Research Foundation, Australian Lions Foundation Disaster Relief and Lions Hearing Dogs. These funds are raised from fines at happy hour each night, a raffle that is drawn at the end of the trip and profits from group dinner catering etc. This year we also got donations from individuals and Clubs.

This year's trip started at Allan and Rose Millars farm at Koondrook Victoria on March 23 where we had 5 Vans and travelled across NSW to the Coast at Taree and then to the Gold Coast where we arrived on April 24 with 22 Vans and one couple who stayed in a cabin. We are now in the process of planning the trip to Darwin next year.

We had a great trip and were pleased to round up the fundraising to \$7,000 and donate at the MD Convention as the members got their hair/beard cut off.





Ladies can participate by becoming a 'Chop Cop'.




